## 1. Introduction

1.1 This website is owned by Raffray Brothers Co Ltd (hereafter “Raffray Brothers”, “we”, “us” and “our”).

1.2 Our Cookie Policy explains what cookies are and how we use them.

## 2. What are cookies?

2.1 Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer or mobile device which remember information about users and website usage, such as language preference or login information for a certain period of time. They are widely used in order to make websites work, or work more efficiently, as well as to provide information to website owners.

2.2 Cookies are used on our website to recognise you from other users. This enables us to offer you a positive browsing experience while also allowing us to improve our website. By continuing to use our website, you agree to our use of cookies in accordance with the conditions of this policy.

## 3. Use of cookies

### 3.1 Types of cookies:

A cookie can be classified by its lifespan, purpose and the domain to which it belongs. We use the following types of cookies:

#### 3.1.1. Strictly necessary/ essential cookies

These are essential cookies enabled for the proper functioning of our website and used to perform basic functions. Without these cookies, our website may not function as intended. For this reason, they do not require your consent.

##### **YouTube**

If you visit one of our pages featuring a YouTube plugin, a connection to the YouTube servers is established. Here the YouTube server is informed about which of our pages you have visited.

##### **Vimeo**

Our website uses features provided by the Vimeo video portal. This service is provided by Vimeo Inc., 555 West 18th Street, New York, New York 10011, USA.

If you visit one of our pages featuring a Vimeo plugin, a connection to the Vimeo servers is established. Here the Vimeo server is informed about which of our pages you have visited. In addition, Vimeo will receive your IP address. This also applies if you are not logged in to Vimeo when you visit our plugin or do not have a Vimeo account. The information is transmitted to a Vimeo server in the US, where it is stored.

If you are logged in to your Vimeo account, Vimeo allows you to associate your browsing behavior directly with your personal profile. You can prevent this by logging out of your Vimeo account.

##### **Google Web Fonts**

### SoundCloud

On our pages, plugins of the SoundCloud social network (SoundCloud Limited, Berners House, 47-48 Berners Street, London W1T 3NF, UK) may be integrated. The SoundCloud plugins can be recognized by the SoundCloud logo on our site.

When you visit our site, a direct connection between your browser and the SoundCloud server is established via the plugin. This enables SoundCloud to receive information that you have visited our site from your IP address. ## 5. Managing Cookies

We request your consent before placing cookies on your device. Since consent must result from a positive action, the cookie category checkboxes are unchecked by default for you to expressly opt-in to cookie use except for strictly necessary cookies which do not require your consent.

You can withdraw your consent at any time through an opt-out option where you can enable or disable particular cookies as per as your choices in the 'Cookie Settings' or by deleting your cookies using your internet browser settings. You can further manage cookies as you wish by changing your browser settings or by clearing your browsing history. Please note that if you disable performance and targeting cookies, it is possible that any advertising you receive will be less targeted as a result, but the site should function correctly. However, if you disable functional cookies, you may be unable to access

certain areas of our website and certain functions or pages will not work in the usual way. You will also lose some saved information, for instance e.g., saved login details and site preferences.

Any inaction or action other than a positive one is considered a refusal, and non-strictly necessary cookies cannot be placed. For instance, an action like scrolling does not mean implied consent since it does not constitute an adequate affirmative action which provides clear consent.

Consent is always verifiable. We have the following controls in place to ensure that we can demonstrate consent in every case:

- run regular audits of consent collection methods on the website/application, which may be done by outsourcing the same to the third party responsible for consent collection for the website/application concerned.
- information on the implemented tools and configurations (such as CMPs) may be kept, in a time-stamped manner, by the third parties responsible for the tools themselves.
- the different versions of the code used by the subject collecting consent can be handed to a third party, or 'hashed' and then published in a time-stamped manner on a public platform for the purposes of proving its authenticity when needed.

We keep detailed records of consent through a consent log and can evidence at a minimum:

- that the individual was able to make an informed choice prior to giving consent. (Cookies' purposes clearly defined);
- that the individual has consented to the use and processing of their personal data by expressly accepting our Cookies;
- and that the individual has been advised of our company name and third party using the data.

## **6. Retention period of cookies**

We have defined the duration for all the cookies used on our website under Section 3.

We ensure that the lifespan of cookies is not extended with every new visit and retention periods are periodically reviewed to ensure that their duration is limited to what is strictly necessary.

## **7. Cookie Banner/Pop-up**

A cookie pop-up or cookie banner appears when you visit a website. It also allows you to either accept or refuse cookies. It informs you that your personal data is being collected, how it is being collected and for which purposes it is being collected. It also collects your consent to use your data.

**Our website uses cookie banner/pop-up to collect your consent for data collection and to inform you how your data is being processed.**

#### **8. Changes to this Cookie Policy**

**We keep our Cookie Policy under regular review and we may update it from time to time. We will notify you of significant changes through automatic pop-ups on our website.
